2nd Grade Curriculum

READING – McGraw Hill (Wonders)

St. Margaret adopted a new reading series based on the best practices and the latest research based teaching strategies. The students are exposed to a variety of genres with emphasis placed on phonics, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension, and writing. The program provides ample practice and application of those skills using an array of tools and activities suited to all types of learners. A student workbook is provided for reinforcement. Students use text-dependent questions to improve comprehension skills and interpreting the genre piece read. SMCS uses Accelerated Reader and STAR Reading to motivate students to read and monitor their success.

LANGUAGE/WRITING – McGraw Hill (Wonders)

Students explore sentence structure, nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, pronouns, conjunctions, and subject/verb agreement. They practice creative writing, paragraph composition, and letter writing.

SPELLING/SPALDING (Phonics/Handwriting Program)

Spalding is taught in conjunction with our reading program in order to enhance and develop a love of reading, use of a rich vocabulary, and the understanding of the structure of the English language. This program develops a child's reading ability through phonemic awareness, phonics and spelling, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension.

MATH – Scott Foresman

Students increase incrementally in telling time and money skills to double-digit addition and subtraction. Basic facts are mastered for addition and subtraction up to eighteen. Graphing is taught using bar charts and graphs, and problem solving skills are stressed. Critical thinking and problem solving skills are practiced daily.

SCIENCE – Scott Foreman

Students learn the scientific process through observing, classifying, experimenting, and inferring. Other areas of study include plants, animals, dinosaurs, physical science, weather, the Sun and stars, and the human body.

SOCIAL STUDIES – MyWorld

Beginning with American History, governmental operations and geography are taught. They read and understand simple maps and the Globe. Hands-on projects are completed throughout the year to reinforce knowledge.

RELIGION

The theme entails preparation for the first reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion, with the law of God and Salvation History as background. The lesson emphasizes God's mercy and love, and covers Creation, the Covenant with Moses, the Ten Commandments, Redemption, Forgiveness of Sins, and the Mass.
