Technology Program

St. Margaret Catholic School is committed to advancing technology in our curriculum and instruction. We have over 200 computers in our Pre-K – 8th grade classrooms. Each classroom provides a technology station equipped with a document camera and laptop for students needing remedial instruction in Reading and Math. A wide variety of media and databases (i.e. BrainPop, EBSCO, Education City, Discovery Education) are implemented daily. All grade level classrooms are equipped with Promethean or Smart Boards.

Technology is also used in communication with students, parents, and the community through the use of School Messenger, the school website, Facebook, and OnCourse, a student information system. A technology committee comprised of faculty and the technology coordinator creates short and long term plans for equipment rotation.

- The Computer Literacy Lab
 - 25 desktop computers and presentation system
 - Type to Learn Program is used in elementary grades to teach typing fluency
 - Components of Microsoft Office are used with students in grades 5 – 8.
- The Jo Self Library and Media Center
 - Smart Board, a document camera, 30 iPads, 2 mobile carts with 46 Chromebooks, and 4 searching stations with access to the library management software
 - Lab with 10 computers used for the Accelerated Reader program and information skills instruction
- Mobile Computer Lab
 - 20 laptops used to improve students' understanding of Math, Language Arts, and Science

Admission Policy

Admission Priority

1. Students from families currently enrolled in St. Margaret Catholic School
2. Children whose sibling or parent completed the 8th grade at SMCS
3. Children from this church parish and students transferring from out of town who have history of Catholic education and whose families have registered in the this parish; priorities within this category will be determined by seniority as a registered St. Margaret Church parishioner or parish from which they were transferred
4. Catholic children from parishes that do not have Catholic schools
5. Catholic children from parishes that have Catholic schools
6. Children of other faiths

The principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student, whether presently enrolled or under consideration for admission, who in the opinion of the principal will not be successful academically or behaviorally at St. Margaret Catholic School, or whose parents/guardians have not complied with school policies or procedures.

Admission Requirements

Pre-Kindergarten 3: Must be three (3) years old on or before September 30 of the calendar year in which the school year begins

Pre-Kindergarten: Must be four (4) years old on or before September 30 of the calendar year in which the school year begins

Kindergarten: Must be five (5) years old on or before September 30 of the calendar year in which the school year begins

First Grade: Must be six (6) years old on or before September 30 of the calendar year in which the school year begins

The following documents must be presented at the time of application for admission:

1. State birth certificate (a copy to be kept at the school)
2. Baptismal certificate (Catholics only)
3. Immunization record (Health card)
4. Official transcript of previous grades, test scores, and medical information
5. In the event of a court ordered custody, the custodial parent/guardian will supply the school with a copy of the court order establishing custody

Student Eligibility

- Students educational needs and school history are considered in determining eligibility for enrollment
- Students who have been suspended or expelled from any school are not eligible for enrollment
- Students who are under disciplinary action from any school are not eligible for enrollment
- If a student enrolls in SMCS and the majority of his/her peers, students, or teachers are negatively affected, the student may be asked to leave
- Information provided to the school is verified. False or misleading information given can result in an invalid registration and the student will be asked to leave
